Adams County Fire Department gives participants a look at the possible careers in the field of Emergency Services. Prepare to jump on to the scene of a fire! Students will interact with firefighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and nurses. Adams county Fire Protection is an all hazards emergency response agency. Emergency Response situations include FIRE, EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, HAZMAT and TECHNICAL RESCUE.

What you will do on site:

This five-night program is filled with discussions, demonstrations, and hands-on skills related to Emergency Medical Services, Firefighting, and Technical Rescue. Registration is available on E9to5.org.

1. Ambulance orientation and Helicopter Operations
2. CPR review and medical skills including IVs Intubation and Medication administration
3. Fire behavior, extinguisher demo, and propane burn evolutions
4. Auto Extrication and Rescue
5. Donning PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) and SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) Maze
